GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES: All courses noted with a \* symbol are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be fully online, in-person, or a combination of both.

**Nursing Core Theory Courses:**

<sup>^</sup>Courses are theory courses that are offered online. Exams will be Online Live, Thursday's from 6:00-8:00 pm.

<sup>^^</sup>Courses have in-person lab component. In person labs for part time ADN students will be at the Health Education Center (Shell Lake).

**Nursing Clinical Courses:**

<sup>#</sup>All courses are clinical courses. Students will be placed in a day or evening clinical at a North or South location.

Clinical courses may be six to eight hour shifts. Clinicals may start as early as 6:00 AM for a day shift and 2:00 PM for an evening shift.

Clinical courses also require simulation and will be in person at the Health Education Center (Shell Lake)

**Semester Two - Long Term Care (Ash, RL, NR) or Critical Access Medical Surgical (Sup):** This clinical will be the last five weeks of the semester. You will attend one week of onsite clinicals held on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays. The other weeks will be in class learning at the Health Education Center (HEC). Students will focus on physical assessment, therapeutic communication, and medication administration. Basic nursing skills will be performed. Clinical will be during the daytime hours.

**Semester Three and Four - Long-Term Care (Ash, NR) or Critical Assess (RL, Sup):** This clinical will be the the last five weeks of the semester. You will attend one week of onsite clinicals held on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays. The other weeks will be in class learning at the Health Education Center (HEC). Students will focus on physical assessment, therapeutic communication, medication administration and management of the nursing unit. Basic nursing skills will be performed. Clinical will be during the day or evening.

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**Semester Six - Acute Clinical Care:** This on site clinical will be 8 weeks and held on Wednesdays or Thursdays. Other time will be in simulation at the Health Education Center (HEC) and /or various clinical sites such as Behavioral Health or Wound Clinic.

Students will focus on complex health alterations of patients across the lifespan. Advanced nursing skills will be performed. Clinicals will be in the day or evening.

**Semester Eight - Acute Clinical Care:** This on site clinical will be 8 weeks and held on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. One to two days will be spent in simulation at the Health Education Center (HEC).

Students will continue their focus on complex health alterations of patients across the lifespan. Skills such as time management, delegation and management of the nursing unit will be practiced. Advanced nursing skills will be performed. Clinical will be in the day or evening.

**Transitions:** Four-week clinical: 80+ hour preceptor-led clinical that will be held at a variety of sites.

Students will be asked which sites they may be interested in completing this clinical. For this clinical, students will complete their hours during the hours the nurse preceptor is assigned. This could be days, evenings, nights or weekend hours and can be eight to 12-hour shifts.

Grade Requirements:

*All courses in the ADN program (core nursing, science, general studies, prerequisites, and electives) must be completed with a grade of 2.0 or better including 10806177 General Anatomy & Physiology and 10806179 Advanced Anatomy & Physiology.*

*For all 10543XXX courses, course repeat and failure policies exist within the ADN Program that allow for only a certain number of retakes and failures of these classes, please refer to these for details.*

Financial Aid Information:

Students who complete all general education courses prior to starting the ADN Part-time program will have difficulties with financial aid eligibility. Financial aid requires that students enroll in at least six credits. If you have completed or will complete all general education courses prior to starting, please make sure to meet with your advisor to discuss your options.

If you have completed General Education coursework at Northwood Tech in a prior term, the same options will apply for your program requirements. Pending Dean approval, technical diploma coursework (i.e. catalog number beginning with 30, 31, or 32) may also be allowed to meet General Education requirements. NOTE: Technical diploma level coursework may not transfer to a baccalaureate program.<sup>^</sup>

**ELECTIVE COURSES:** To meet the elective course requirements for this program, you will be required to take associate degree level coursework, i.e., catalog numbers beginning with a 10 (with the exception of General College courses 10831103, 10834109, 10835103, and 10838104). Pending program dean approval, technical diploma level coursework, i.e. catalog number beginning with 30, 31, or 32, may also be allowed to meet elective credit requirements for this program. NOTE: Technical diploma level coursework may not transfer to a baccalaureate program.<sup>^</sup>

**GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:** *Although your academic advisor can provide guidance, you are ultimately responsible for selecting courses that meet a program's graduation requirements. If you do not take courses in the recommended sequence above, it may delay your completion of graduation requirements. A program plan GPA of 2.0 in a 4.0 grade system is required to graduate.*

A grade point of 2.0 or better is needed in all required courses. (program courses, general education and electives)
