√This is an OER (Open Educational Resources) course, meaning you do not have to buy a textbook. Instead, you will use internet resources and documents posted in Blackboard. If you are taking the course online, you are expected to regularly engage in the course throughout the week, with interactive assignments (such as midweek discussions). You will need to record your speeches in front of a live audience of four (audience members must be able to read and write to provide feedback). You can have a live virtual audience (e.g., via Facebook live) in order to follow safe-gathering guidelines. You will need a reliable recording device to record speeches and upload videos to YouTube.
