Physical Skills	 The student must demonstrate: Gross motor for data collection/assessment, intervention, and to promote a safe environment. Fine motor/dexterity to manipulate small objects and complete procedures or assessments. Endurance, strength, mobility, balance, flexibility, and coordination to perform client care activities and emergency procedures. 	 Sufficient gross and fine motor coordination to exhibit excellent eye-hand coordination and dexterity to manipulate equipment, lift, stoop or bend in the delivery of safe laboratory testing Satisfactory physical strength and endurance to be on feet for extended periods and to move heavy equipment and supplies, Lifting a 20-pound weight from the ground to waist level Sitting, walking, bending, and reaching motions
Sensory Skills	 The student must demonstrate: Vision sufficient for observation and assessment of patient care. Tactile, auditory, visual, and olfactory ability for data collection/assessment and to promote a safe care environment. Ability to tolerate exposure to odors and common allergens. 	 Sufficient vision to observe microscopic cells and features within cells (MLT only), read records, manipulate equipment, and visually read procedures, graphs and test results Detect equipment alarms/sounds Able to discern various scents in the identification of microorganisms (MLT only), urinalysis testing and chemical analyses
Communication Skills	 The student must have the ability to: Communicate effectively with patients/clients, families, peers, supervisors, members of the public, and other healthcare professionals. Observe, recognize, respond to, and use appropriate non-verbal communication. Listen and respond to others in a nonjudgmental, respectful manner. Speak, read, comprehend, interpret, and convey information. 	 Satisfactory speaking, reading and writing skills to effectively communicate in English Maintain clear, concise and accurate laboratory records and reports Time management of multiple priorities, multiple stimuli in fast-paced environments Organize workload and manage time to complete technical tasks within realistic time limits Calmly react to urgent situations
