The Best Trees You're Not Planting, but Should

Trees are the plants that live the longest in most of our gardens and are the most important for the environment. Are we planting the best trees for our climate? Maybe not. Some trees that will thrive in northern gardens now and in the future may not be sold in nurseries due to difficulty growing them in pots or their being borderline hardy in our current climate. In this talk, Mary will recommend a dozen or more trees you may not be planting that will thrive in your northern garden now and in the future, plus another dozen trees that are available but underplanted.
